Statement of Evidence to Probate Commissioner

The name first appears in 1851 when a short section, parallel to the river, was created by the Sutton Coldfield Inclosure Award, as path No. LV. (The Award is held by Warwickshire County Record Office QJS75/11, 1/1). The route is shown on the map published by the Poor Law Survey of Warwickshire in 1869, in various parcels. The Book of Reference lists these as:- Curdworth No.3: meadow, footway and stream; No.4: meadow, occupation road, footway and stream; and Sutton Coldfield Nos. 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10: meadow, occupation road, footway and stream. In all cases the numbers included the suffix 'or' or 'part'. Highways (Held by WCRG at OS100/297).

The first chart is shown the first edition of the
Aeronautic survey six inch map, 1887.

The whole route is shown on the deposited plans for the Birmingham Tame & the Ellesmere Canal, dated 1856, for the acquisition of the land. It is labelled on the plan as "Footpath to be stopped up", while the Book of Reference includes "Instructions for sale & the description of each parcel (parcels 125, 124, 123, 122, 121, 202, 203,
